The sign-in sheet with names of members and guest is attached. A quorum was present.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETINGS:

Minutes from the August 3, 2005 board minutes were approved as read. Bill-AB7WJ requested the name and address of the adjacent property owner be entered in the August 3, 2005 minutes. This will be done as soon as the information is available.

SECRETARYS REPORT:

Al-K7HW reported receipt of bank statements, post office bulk mail renewal notice, donation to the Mac Parks Memorial Fund, application for new membership and renewals, and news letters from other amateur radio clubs.

Application for renewal of the Radio Club of Tacoma designation as a Special Service Club has been forwarded to the ARRL.

TREASURERS REPORT:

Pat-KD7TRC, distributed copies of the August, 2005 report of receipts and

disbursements, a copy is attached.

Pat discussed the requirement for up-to-date signature cards for a CD that will mature in December. New signature cards will be provided to the bank.

Pat requested board approval of the scholarship committee report recommendation to awarding a \$500.00 scholarship to Michael J. Jurasek for the fall quarter at Highline Community College. A motion to approve the report and write the check received a second and was approved.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

The President announced the appointment of the following members to the Planning

Committee: Al-K7HW chairman, Rich-KR7W, Paul-K7AXJ, and Nick-K7MO members.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Rich-KR7W reported that the planning committee has been meeting weekly for the past few weeks. Many favorable and non-favorable policies, procedures and organizational deficiencies have been identified. The next step is the production of policy and procedure manuals, outline recommended duties and responsibilities for the leadership positions, and adopt an organizational chart delineating paths of coordination and responsibility. It is hoped this process can be completed by the end of the year.

Frank-AC7JY made a preliminary report of the August ham-fest. While the ham-fest was very successful, with table sales numbers up, attendance at the door was down. While all bills have not yet been received, it appears our net proceeds will exceed last year. Frank will make a full report when all is completed.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Rodney-WV7O, gave a report of his investigation of possibilities for a fund-raising project by signing up with the State Department of Transportation and operating (continued on page 6)

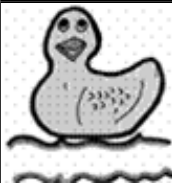

TALL TOWER TALE

It all started on a sunny August day when Paul, AD7GN told John AC7WW about the tower that was on order and due to be delivered the end of August or first week in September. Paul figured that with the help of seven or eight strong men, he would be able to get the 1600 pound tower and its crate up the hill from where the trucking company was going to drop it next to the curb in front of his house. And as a fellow ham, John volunteered to help.

John received a land line on Monday August 29th about ten in the morning from Paul's wife, Brenda, "The truck is in Kent!" Paul was attending meetings at school. John asked, "How many others are going to help?" Brenda said, "Only our neighbor Herb!" Wow! We need help. John telephoned Al K7HW who was with Paul, K7AXJ. They both would help. While John, XYL Connie and a neighbor Harold were on their way to Paul's home in Fife Heights, the W7DK repeater came alive with Al, AC7BU and Rick, KE7EMW. John threw in his call and asked if they could help with the tower? Al had a winch on his jeep and Rick could bring a couple of his teenage sons. Things are looking up, we now have seven or eight able bodied persons.

Paul came home and the trucking company called to verify that we had a loading dock or forklift to unload the 1600 pound tower from the truck. Paul informed them that it was supposed to be drop shipped at the curb, after all how many residences have a loading dock?

Delivery was rescheduled for Tuesday. Al, K7HW with Paul, K7AXJ had arrived and Al, AC7BU and Rick, KE7EMW were told Tuesday was the day.

Tuesday about eleven in the morning, K7HW was on site as AC7WW and XYL arrived. AC7BU, KE7EMW with his teenage sons, (Philemon, Elisha, and Gilead) and Paul's neighbor Herb were all there. AD7GN left his meetings and came to the QTH. As we watched the street, an eighteen wheeler from Watson's Trucking came down the street with blinkers on.

The excitement was mounting! Trucker parked and AD7GN grabbed the crow bar as soon as the door was lifted up. He started prying the crate apart. The rest of us were still talking (you know how hams are) about how to go about this project. Trucker wanted to back the truck up, we had to wrestle AD7GN away from the crowbar and get him off the truck. AC7BU parked the jeep about 25 feet behind the truck and pulled out the cable, looped it around the end of the crate and began pulling the crate out of the truck.

Yea, after one end is on the ground how are we going to lift all that weight off the truck, Can't just let it drop. Well with just about a foot of the crate still on the truck, the driver pulled out the bill of lading and said that total weight was only 848 pounds. Tower was over 200 pounds, so we cut the side of the crate off while one end was still resting on the back of the truck and lifted the tower out and carried it up the hill to the site. AC7WW's XYL was busy taking pictures.

After the remains of the crate were cleaned off the street, Brenda and her daughters (Peggy, Andrea, and Elizabeth) served us hamburgers and chips for lunch.

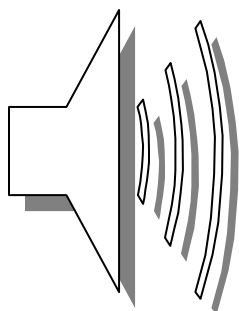
